<b>Evaluation Process</b>	Evaluation is held at different levels. Among youngsters we use informal methods. We talk to youngsters, give them space to develop ideas and reflect on what is not working. Among the teams we work with the handbook of youth work that has templates for different fields (both logistical and methodological). To donate we also have a survey and on its base it is held annually.

<b>Needs Assessment</b>	A deep relation to youngsters is the base of communication, beside this we also use non formal participation processes to find out.
<b>Seasonal or Year-Round</b>	It is active year round. But in winter it has beside the fixed places to go additional activities at schools, festivals and local events

<b>Your Definition of a MYC</b>	Youth work should be available for ALL young people. Often this is not possible in some kind of areas, because there are no youth centres. So the mobile youth centres can bring the activities to the youngsters in those areas and give them the opportunity to participate. Also important is that with a mobile youth centre you come to the spaces where youngsters are, so you are the guest in their space. That creates a different atmosphere than in a "usual" youth centre (building).
<b>Managing Entity</b>	Nonprofit "Roter Baum" Berlin, focused on open youth work
<b>Type of funding</b>	Public funding
<b>Initial Funding</b>	Funded by government/youth department
<b>Operational Funding</b>	Government/youth department + "Gewaltpräventionsmittel" (violence prevention program)

<b>Official Project Name</b>	Tinemobilul
<b>Regions Served</b>	Prahova County, Romania
<b>Specific Areas</b>	Upper Teleajen Valley
<b>Type of Area</b>	Rural
<b>Your Definition of a MYC</b>	A Mobile Youth Centre is a moving facility that can offer youth services. The youth services should be similar to the ones provided in the "stationary" Youth Centres, but with an emphasis on reaching areas that don't have access to other youth services.
<b>Managing Entity</b>	Non profit "Curba de Cultura".
<b>Type of funding</b>	ESC and Erasmus+ projects related to Mobile Youth Work and Centres
<b>Initial Funding</b>	The creation of the Mobile Youth Centre was funded by an European Solidarity Corps solidarity project, after the organization purchased the van that was turned into the centre.
<b>Operational Funding</b>	The operational costs are covered by the organization, through ESC and Erasmus + projects related to Mobile Youth Work and Centres.
<b>Activities Offered</b>	We are offering activities for spending free time. We offer sports activities, board games, arts and crafts, playstation games, cooking activities and others. During summer we also do outdoor movie nights. At the same time the space is open for proposals and if any participants want to approach more serious topics we are up to it.
<b>Target Age Group</b>	10–25
<b>Specialization</b>	Our activities are a lot of times dependent on the skills and interests of the volunteers who implement them, with one constant element, the need for a learning objective behind the activities.

<b>Evaluation Process</b>	The evaluation process is generally informal. We discuss with the youngsters what they enjoyed and what they would like to do more of. Also with the volunteers proposing and implementing the ideas we have an evaluation process consisting in analyzing the activities and what can be improved.
<b>Needs Assessment</b>	From time to time we do a needs analysis research to see what the interests of young people in our area are. But on a more day to day basis we ask the participants what they would like to do and what from our activities they enjoy most. And every time we try something new we ask them about it.
<b>Seasonal or Year-Round</b>	Seasonal (April to October)
<b>Public Route/Time Info</b>	Every season we make a schedule of all the activities that we publish. At the beginning of every week we post the places we go in the week and the day of the activity we announce again. We do this by using social media, with posts and stories.
<b>Communication Channels</b>	Social media + collaboration with local actors (teachers, youth, cultural centres) and we communicate to them our presence and they share it in their local groups.
<b>Staff Employed</b>	Yes, plus volunteers
<b>Staff Training</b>	Staff trained in youth work, but not specifically mobile youth work

<b>Your Definition of a MYC</b>	A safe place where youth can come to spend free time and get the support of professionals to do so.
<b>Managing Entity</b>	Run by a public institute founded by the municipality; majority of funds from municipal budget
<b>Type of funding</b>	Mixed funding (Municipal budget, partial commercial renting, Erasmus+ projects)
<b>Initial Funding</b>	Public institute via municipal budget, in collaboration with Public Transport – Ljubljana
<b>Operational Funding</b>	Municipal budget, partial commercial renting, Erasmus+ projects
<b>Activities Offered</b>	We offer a combination of activities: "daily centre" is the most common one and the default state when we come to the location to provide active spending of their free time through sports, board games, cards, talking prompt cards etc. We also do some programmes with outside collaborators in these locations; and we're also doing more pop-up events if we're invited to show up at the location as long as there's content synergy.
<b>Target Age Group</b>	Ideally 15–29; in reality mostly 12–15
<b>Specialization</b>	Initially culture; now no particular focus

<b>Evaluation Process</b>	Yes. We have yearly planning of the budget and content. Every quartal we go through the Logbook numbers to see the attendance and any possible trends that might occur. We also have intervison and supervision in our organization to support the youth workers.
<b>Needs Assessment</b>	Through direct communication and different possibilities of youth engagement (they can easily apply a "youth initiative" to address their needs, or for larger ideas they can also write a project). Before holidays we offer them questionnaires to provide feedback and at the end of the year participants above certain age do Logbook evaluations.

<b>Your Definition of a MYC</b>	A centre that answers the needs of youngsters on the street, outside physical youth centres. Mobile youth workers reach out to them in their own environment, either with street youth work or mobile youth centres.

<b>Type of funding</b>	Public funding
<b>Initial Funding</b>	Government-funded (Municipality of Ljubljana); in general the whole Young dragons are a public institute and were established in 2009 by the City Municipality of Ljubljana (MOL).
<b>Operational Funding</b>	Municipality of Ljubljana and some district communities under it
<b>Activities Offered</b>	Our main goal is for youngsters to spend their free time as quality as they can, helping them on their journey to become independent adults. We offer different activities - sports, art, informing them, offering safe space to talk about anything - trending problems, growing up, health info etc. Also offering them a budget to come up with new activities and projects, while taking care of the environment and connecting with the community.

<b>Your Definition of a MYC</b>	The purpose of mobile youth work is to meet young people where they are active or where there are no or few services for young people. In mobile youth work, the Nuori Espoo van named Keijo and Kerttu, are equipped as a "mobile youth facility", and are used as a working tool, and the activity equipment is also mobile.
<b>Managing Entity</b>	City of Espoo municipal youth services
<b>Type of funding</b>	Public funding
<b>Initial Funding</b>	Annual municipal youth work budget
<b>Operational Funding</b>	Covered through the same annual budget
<b>Activities Offered</b>	The activities are mainly produced outside, but also they have an opportunity to use our schools especially in the evenings and winter time when it is cold and snowy. The van can host 10 young people at a time. Activities: Boardgames, game consoles, TV, sport equipment like footballs, basketballs etc. Scooters, skates, hoverboards for kids to borrow. There is also a chance to have different events, like discos.

<b>Specialization</b>	Leisure time activities for youth

<b>Evaluation Process</b>	Statistical data collected; activities planned and evaluated every 6 months

## 11. VanGO!

<b>Official Project Name</b>	VanGO! – Centrul de tineret mobil
<b>Regions Served</b>	Constanța County, Romania
<b>Specific Areas</b>	Constanța County
<b>Type of Area</b>	Rural
<b>Your Definition of a MYC</b>	Our Mobile Youth Centre, called Vango, is a flexible and innovative youth space on wheels. It allows us to bring activities, workshops, and safe spaces directly to young people in rural and underserved areas where access to youth services is limited. Instead of expecting young people to travel long distances, Vango comes to them, offering opportunities for learning, creativity, social connection, and personal growth.
<b>Managing Entity</b>	Non profit “Asociația Luna și Noi”
<b>Type of funding</b>	Mixed funding
<b>Initial Funding</b>	The initial funding for Vango came from a national CSR grant of €10,000. This allowed us to purchase the trailer and build the Vango mobile centre, making our vision of a youth space on wheels a reality.
<b>Operational Funding</b>	The daily operational costs of Vango (fuel, maintenance, materials for activities, etc.) are supported mainly through ongoing European Solidarity Corps funding, occasional local partnerships with municipalities, and small-scale fundraising initiatives, such as local donation campaigns and events. We aim to keep Vango sustainable through a mix of project-based grants and community support.
<b>Activities Offered</b>	VanGO offers a wide range of activities depending on the community’s needs! Some of the activities include creative workshops (art, DIY, music sessions), nonformal education activities, board games, youth-led discussions, health and well-being information sessions, career orientation support, and community building events. VanGO creates a safe, informal, and fun space where young people can relax, learn, and connect.
<b>Target Age Group</b>	12–21 years old

<b>Specialization</b>	While VanGO is a general youth center on wheels, it places a special emphasis on youth empowerment and participation. Through VanGO, we aim to foster active citizenship, personal development, creativity, and solidarity among rural youth.
<b>Evaluation Process</b>	Yes! We use a mix of informal and formal evaluation tools. After each VanGO visit, we collect feedback through quick youth-friendly questionnaires and informal group talks. For larger projects, we conduct structured evaluations, including self-assessment activities with young people and reflection sessions with the team, to adapt and improve VanGO's services.
<b>Needs Assessment</b>	We maintain a very close and ongoing dialogue with our community! We regularly talk with young people during VanGO activities, run polls and surveys both offline and online, and organize participatory planning sessions where young people can propose and vote on activities. This way, VanGO stays dynamic, relevant, and truly youth-led.
<b>Seasonal or Year-Round</b>	VanGO was designed to be active year-round! However, during the first year, technical and legal challenges (such as registration and safety approvals) temporarily interrupted our visits from January to summer. With these challenges now being addressed, and with the successful testing of our solar-powered electrical system (which even handles heating!), we are confident that VanGO will operate year-round moving forward.
<b>Public Route/Time Info</b>	We announce VanGO's routes and schedules on our NGO's social media pages (mainly Instagram and Facebook) and through posters and announcements in local community spaces like schools, libraries, and town halls.
